

# 7TH GRADE 1st QUARTER NEWSLETTER

## **MATH**

On-Level: Students are finishing the Geometry Unit and will take the Common Benchmark Assessment by September 18th. The next unit of study is Inferences where students will collect and analyze data. The inferences unit will conclude in late October.

Accelerated: Students have finished the Geometry unit and will take the Inferences Common Benchmark Assessment in mid-October. We will finish up the 7th grade curriculum and begin the 8th grade curriculum in early November.

## ELA

The first nine weeks are devoted to literary standards with an emphasis on basic grammar skills. The students are reading at high volumes and analyzing texts on a daily basis. The writing focus for this nine weeks is argumentative and narrative. We will also focus on letter formatting to prepare them for the CBA.

Please encourage your child to have a novel with them on a daily basis. They can check one out at the Learning Commons, or you can purchase one for them to have in class. There is also a public library just down the road from the school. There will be times they will have the opportunity to read at school, and we also encourage reading at home.

#### **SOCIAL STUDIES**

The first nine weeks will be devoted to learning about the Middle East. Students will be learning about the geography, diversity of religions & ethnic groups, and history of U.S. involvement in SW Asia (Middle East).

This includes an overview of general facts about Judaism, Christianity, and Islam; their basic beliefs, founders, symbols, holy days, and customs. Students will also examine how people and their beliefs have influenced the history of the Middle East and how they are still affecting the world today.

The anniversary of 9/11 is coming up soon. This is an important part of American history and tied directly to our 7th grade standards. We encourage you to share your memories of 9/11 with your student.

#### **SCIENCE**

Seventh grade life science has been focused on making qualitative and quantitative observations. We also have been working on using scientific processes. In September, we will be working on exploring the characteristics of living things. Smithgall Woods will be here on September 12<sup>th</sup> to introduce us to scientific classification. We will spend most of September exploring historical and modern day classification.

# **GRADE LEVEL INFORMATION**

Reminders of our CBMS non-negotiables:


# **Connections**
