MATH

The beginning of our year has been mathmagical. In all levels of math we have been focusing on becoming mathematical thinkers and understanding the why behind our processes for problem solving! On level 8th grade math classes are wrapping up our transformations unit while the coordinate algebra classes are wrapping up our unit on modeling functions and moving on to reasoning with equations and inequalities.

*Just a few reminders for this grading period:

- Students will have homework most nights and should be completing these assignments before returning to class if no actual assignment is given then students are encouraged to review notes on a nightly basis
- 8th Grade Math Students are encouraged to have a Ti-30xs Multiview Calculator with them in class and during most assessments; Coordinate Algebra Students are encouraged to have a Ti-84 Graphing calculator but a Ti_30xx Multiview Calculator will also be efficient for this course.

ELA

Language Arts started with our students proclaiming they will be "Masters of their fates, and captains of their souls" this year. After studying "Invictus" and "Whatever it Takes," we have moved into grade specific work.

In 8th grade, we are working on how authors use dialogue and incidents to move the plot forward. We are accomplishing this through short stories, as well as the novel *Long Way Down*, by Jason Reynolds.

In 9th grade, we are working on the hero's journey and applying it to *The Odyssey* by Homer. Students are also reading a novel of their choice. They are also doing comparison/contrasts between their independent novel, the hero's journey, and *The Odyssey*.

Independent reading in essential to all of our classes, so please talk with your student and help them find books they enjoy reading. Take them to the library or the bookstore if you can. We appreciate any support you can give us in this endeavor. We want our students to find joy in reading, and the best way to do that is to let them read what they like.

SCIENCE

In 8th grade science we are focusing on learning more about how things move and why they move – forces and motion. Students have been learning about speed, velocity, acceleration, and net forces.
